

SC Council on the Holocaust Traveling Exhibits

The South Carolina Council on the Holocaust is proud to host two traveling exhibits for use across South Carolina - *Stars without a Heaven: Children in the Holocaust* and *What Now? Holocaust Survivors - Between Rebirth and Remembrance*. These two exhibits were created by Yad Vashem and can be loaned out to schools or civic organizations. The SCCH loans out these exhibits for up to 4 weeks and a \$50 non-refundable deposit is required to cover the transportation, delivery, and pickup facilitated by the SCCH.

Stars without a Heaven is dedicated to the unique stories of children during the Holocaust as told by through their toys, sketches, and writing and how they expressed their hopes, dreams, and fears during this time.

What Now? is centered on the challenges faced by Holocaust survivors after liberation in rebuilding their lives alongside their pain.
